We continued to function virtually due to the pandemic and handed out masks and sanitizer, resources and information throughout the year. Community Meetings Two community Meetings were held on two of the proposed charter amendments placed on the ballot. One proposed amendment was on governance and the other on issues of safety. Both were recorded and available on MidtownPhillips.org. Lake Street Recovery Sessions As the demolition and rebuilding initiated, we began a virtual series called 'Lake Street Recovery' where we interviewed businesses about their experiences before, during, and after the destruction of their businesses. This series was recorded and is available on our website. Virtually, we created forums to keep people talking and processing. Outreach Partnerships Our outreach partners were invaluable during this time. Banyan Community continued with monthly block network forums featuring speakers and an ability to speak to what we had all gone through and how to process. Semilla Center for Healing and the Arts continued to host outdoor art making sessions to pull people together, to talk, and to process. Coach Abdul from the New American Youth Soccer Club now owns and operates a security company. They were present on our corridors during and after the civil unrest. Communications Partners Somali TV and our community radio stations KRSM and KALY Radio were on top of getting crucial resource information out, as well as health mandates announced from the State Department of Health, business resources, and rental assistance. KRSM conducted interviews of people in the community. These interviews were presented as a feature of our annual meeting in February 2021 and they remain available on the home page of our website: midtownphillips.org. Neighborhood Safety MPNAI continued its work with and in partnership with the Minneapolis Police Department through interaction with our community crime prevention specialist. Lake Street Council hosted forums with businesses and the criminal justice team to include City, County, State, and Federal resources and District Court judges to address violent crime, narcotic and sex trafficking, ongoing damage to businesses, and an unsafe environment, further victimizing businesses by this impact on their customer base. Members of the MPNAI board participated in these discussions. Phillips Neighbors held virtual meetings 2x per month between East Phillips and Midtown Phillips on safety concerns and solutions. We invited resource people into those discussions to include American Indian CDC, 3rd Precinct Inspector, Crime Prevention Specialist, and Al Bangoura, Superintendent of the Park Board. Encampments Also, during this period, encampments began to build along the Midtown Greenway, in Cityowned vacant lots, and along public sidewalks. For the Midtown Greenway, neighbors and organizations along the Greenway worked with Hennepin County, holding weekly meetings with key staff. Outreach and resource teams worked with each resident of the encampment to ultimately find housing and services to enable a move out of a tent. By December, housing was available for everyone along the Greenway thanks to new housing facilities opened by AVIVO, Red Lake, and American Indian CDC. The County offered transportation to help people move and storage units for their belongings. Anything removed from the Greenway was tagged, labeled, and stored in case someone came looking for it at a later time. During periods of escalating crime, drug and sex trafficking, both Hennepin County Sheriff and the Park Police provided patrol. Outreach teams and law enforcement ensured safety of the residents in the encampment as well as the community from the potential of exploding propane tanks which had been collected and large bonfires adjacent to the propane tanks. While resources and housing were being found, the County and City placed porta potties and trash receptacles on site and weekly did a cleanup of the corridor. Block residents worked with the City of Minneapolis, CPED, outreach workers, and Minneapolis police on encampments on city-owned land - 2600 14th Avenue, 2400 13th Avenue, Speedway, and 2600 Block of Bloomington Avenue (both sides of the street). Residents also monitored theft reports from businesses and homes, a consequence of the escalating street-based drug and sex trade. These challenges, needs, issues, and community work roll right into 2021 and are expected to continue to be a full-time focus well into the future. Community building, policy advocacy, and advocacy for adequate resources to address community needs will continue to direct the work of MPNAI. Events The 18th Annual Phillips Community Clean Sweep occurs in October. All four Phillips Neighborhoods work together on this event in partnership with the Minneapolis Solid Waste & Recycling Department. City Joy, a neighborhood non-profit and Banyan Community organized and donated the lunch. Allina Health care donated the Breakfast and Welna Hardware donated supplies, as did the City. Per the Pandemic hand sanitizer and masks were available and meals were individually packed. A local marching jazz band showed up to welcome back our 1st in person event in 2 years. In addition to the litter pick up component, 6 garbage trucks were available to pick up household waste as well as items dumped in people's yards like tires and mattresses. In non pandemic years we have 750+ people participating. In 2021, we estimated 300 in attendance. Midtown Phillips Festival at Open Streets - Due to the pandemic, we did not organize this event in 2021. MPNAI Annual Meeting & Board Elections - we held our Annual Meeting, brought in Speakers but held it online with board elections and balloting online as well.
